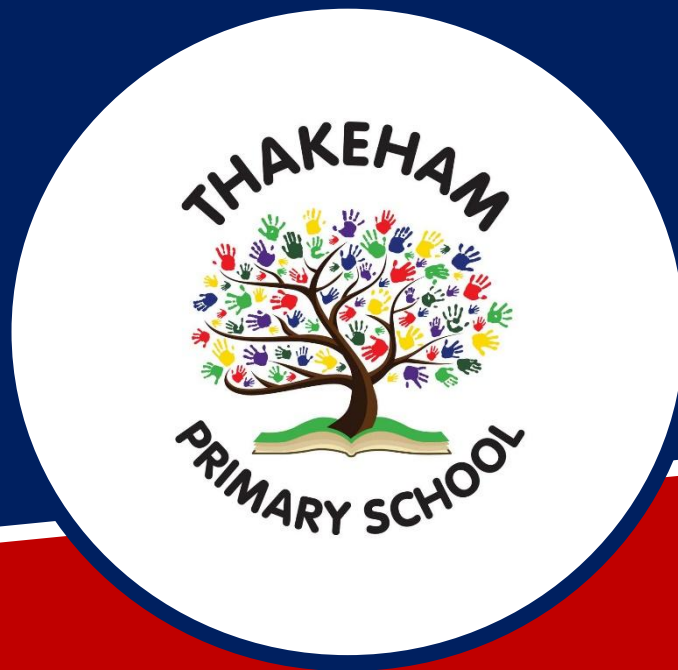
Please remember...
