Our School Values


Care - Cooperation - Honesty - Responsibility - Perseverance - Curiosity - Reflection







HEADS TO TAILS by DERRICK HUGHES. APRIL 4th 2023 at 19.30 at the Old School, School Lane, Storrington, RH20 4LL

Derrick Hughes will talk on his 17 years as a primary school headteacher with a series of humorous anecdotes. His story starts with his schooldays aged 6 and how schools and teaching have changed.

At Nottingham College of Education he discovered a love of teaching but also beekeeping. Teaching was not well paid, so he supplemented his income with guitar lessons. Listen to his model for how to run a school, h ow to deal with bullying and the 'joys' of role playing.
