Through their evaluations, the children reported that they liked supporting each other as it made them feel part of something and parents who have come to support have agreed that it was nice to see such a fantastic, friendly and cohesive atmosphere. This academic year, we are further refining the use of this provision by directing it towards our DA, PP and SEND pupils in the first instance. This is because we feel the provision will effectively help to meet the needs of this group pupils within our curriculum. Our SENCO and Deputy SENCO have worked with the Forest School Teacher to identify targeted pupils to attend. These pupils have ISPs which the team are then supporting with through Forest School.
