

- 2) Add the JIM BECKETT book/s to your shopping basket
- 3) Select 'LOCAL PICKUP' (No postage charge, books will be delivered to the school)
- Enter Billing Address as normal. In ORDER NOTES add 'Thakeham Primary School, CHILD'S NAME & CLASS. Alternatively, you can add these details instead of your shipping address.
- 5) Proceed to payment. (Payments are processed via Paypal but you don't need a Paypal account)
- 6) Books will be handed out to the children & signed by Jim at school on Tuesday 28th February. ORDER DEADLINE: Thursday 9th March at 4pm.

Friday 24th March is a non-uniform day in exchange for cakes or sweets for the stall.


