You can stay safe online this Christmas by making sure you have a secure password. It could be something your friends and family know but even sharing it with your friends can be dangerous. As hackers and scammers can get to you, most Chromebooks or laptops have virus protection but some people can trick you into letting viruses into your computer.

It doesn't do much, but some can hack passwords and some hackers look through your files. It can add files that have the name of the website in your drive this can be deleted by:

- Double-clicking on the files and deleting them
- Deleting all your history on the drive or can be done by double-clicking then swipe down to delete them all (only PC)

People all around the world have this happening but they don't really realize it as they stay in your device unless deleted. For example, one company is constantly tricking others as it just seems like an average website that is very much like chrome but is a website mostly used by adults which lets viruses into their laptop.

This can be avoided by just simply searching if it's a safe website; if it asks you for information check with a trusted adult; make a secure username and password. Even having your username as something like leo454658 can still be dangerous (if your name is Leo) and your password could be your pet's name to be safe.

Christmas time can be extremely busy and fun, but sometimes we need to remember about our own safety as well, sometimes people can get too caught up in the moment and not realise they are being attacked or in danger. Our top tips for online safety are:

- Have secure passwords
- Check your accounts
- If something seems wrong, tell a trusted adult
- Don't share passwords
- While shopping for gifts, make sure to use trusted websites, you can check if it is secure by looking
 in the link and seeing a small lock icon
- Always have permission from your adults before you buy items

Christmas is meant to be a fun time, but to have fun, we need to take care of our own safety. I have been in the situation of someone having unwanted access to my account. As soon as I realised, I changed my password and after that, contacted the website's support, and it all ended well, hackers are not good people for the most part, so we should avoid them.

In conclusion, Christmas should be a fun time for all, not a time to be in danger online.



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What Parents & Carers Need to Know about SETTING UP APPS, GAMES AND SOFTWARE

Millions of new phones, tablets, laptops and games consoles will be nestling under Christmas trees this year. However, even if parents and carers have gone to the trouble of setting up these new devices and enabling the safety features, there are still potential hazards in the apps, games and software that children will want to install and use. Knowing what to look for and discussing those risks with your child may help avoid any nasty surprises this Christmas. Here are our top tips for ensuring that unwrapping this year's presents doesn't unleash any unexpected dangers.

TAKE NOTE OF AGE RATINGS

Back when most games were bought in shops, checking the age roting was easy. It was on the front of the box, Now that most games are downloaded, it's tougher - but not impossible. All reputable download stores show a game's age roting at the point of purchase, and you can check the suitability of a specific title your orbid wants to play at videostandards.org.uk/RatingBoard/games.

FREE' ISN'T ALWAYS FREE

The games market has changed radically in recent years. Many tilles are free to download, but then tempt players to pay for cosmetic temps (as in Fortnite) or to unjock additional content. There can be huge peer pressure for children to pay for these flems. Agree a budget for in-game purchases before the game is downloaded, and make sure children can't authorise in-game purchases by themselves.

DISABLE IN-APP PURCHASING

It's not wise to leave children with devices that can make inhapp purchases without your permission, ideally, set up computers, consoles and phones so child accounts need an adult's authorisation to buy anything. On shared devices (like india, which don't allow user accounts), check the settings to ensure that inhapp purchasing requires the account holder's password, tingerprint or face [D.

CHECK THE SPECS

to avoid let-downs, check a game's specially for PC or Mac, where games often meed a particular graphics chip or processor to work. Sites like system requirements lab.com can scon your computer to see if it will run certain games properly. On consoles, mate sure you're buying the right version some newer Xbox or PlayStation games won't play on older consoles.

MONITOR IN-GAME COMMS

Voice chat with friends is part of the fun of modern gaming — but danger lurks here too. Many titles have open chat systems, meaning that children could speak to strangers or hear edult language and verbal abuse when games get particularly competitive. Using a shared family area (as opposed to alone in bedrooms) for online gaming is a good way to keep an occasional ear on what's being said.

BE WARY OF GIFTS

Titles like Roblox, Minecraft and Fortnite have in-game currencies, which can be earned through progress in the game – but can also be bought with real money. A common scam is for a young player to be collered currency if they click a link, vixit a certain site or contact another user directly. Wann your child about such offers, they should show you if they're in any doubt over an in-game gift.

APPS ARE AGE RATED, TOO

Like games, apps in the major stores have age ratings, too — so you can see in advance whether an app's appropriate for your child. Additionally, phones: parental control settings allow you to set age limits, preventing young ones from downloading unsuitable apps themselves. These ratings aren't infallible, however, we've seem IV apps featuring adult shows with an age rating of 3, for example.

LEGAL APPS THAT BREAK THE LAW

There are many apps that are perfectly legal but enable illegal activity – streamling apps which let people worth factball matches, say, without paying or Sky or BT Sport. Prosecution for using such apps is rare, but they can lead to risky behaviour like viewing rague streams on sites teeming with malicious links. Watch for children installing unusual apps with TV.

CONSIDER STORAGE

Most apps and games will tell you in the antine store how much space they need on a device. Check this carefully – especially with games, which can run into hundreds of megaboyes and beyond. If you don't have enough free storage on a device to run the game or app, you won't get a refund from the store? You can normally check a device's available storage space

IN-APP REGISTRATION

It's common for apps and games to ask users to register; entering personal details like email address, date of birth and other information you might not want your child to divulge. Ask them to get your permission before giving any personal into to an app – and consider using your details rather than the child's, so they're not targeted by marketing spam or put risk of having their data steller.

WATCH OUT FOR IMITATORS

Even in the official stores, untrustworthy regue apps can slip through the net.
Common tricks are apps or games that have go slightly different name to the genuine article (Fortnight rather than Fortnite, for instance) or use logos which deliberately look very similar to the official app. To avoid downloading these imitations, read the app's description and check who the publisher is listed as.

STAY UPDATED

Most games and apps are subject to regular updates, which not only offer new content and features but also provide critical security improvements. Children tend to ignore such updates – usually because they don't understand why they're important or they simply want to get straight on with gaming. Check your child's devices periodically to make your barren understand services are these understand between the status.





MEAL ORDERING WITH PARENTPAY

A new meal ordering system is coming to Thakeham Primary School!

This is for all Free school meals, Universal free meals, and paid meals.

WHEN?

Start booking from 30th January 2023 for lunches starting from 6th March 2023. All lunches up until Friday 3rd March 2023 will continue to be booked via Meal Selector (Paid Parents) or via the school office for KS1 children.

WHO?

Parents/Carers, you will see a new Payment Item in your ParentPay account. You must log in and order meals through this new Payment Item. You MUST order the exact meal in advance for your child on the days you require them to have a hot meal.

Medical diets and Lifestyle can be selected at the point of ordering, medical evidence is still required for allergies.

HOW?

Book your meals through ParentPay and the Chartwells kitchen teams will have the orders on a tablet known as Cypad. This will show the chosen meal along with your child's information on screen, and the meal you ordered to be served that day. All meals are subject to supplier availability.
