## **English**

#### This term our key texts will be:

- To describe how living things are classified into broad groups according to common observable characteristics and based on similarities and differences, including micro-organisms, plants and animals.
- To give reasons for classifying plants and animals based on specific characteristics.
- To describe the differences in the life cycles of a mammal, an amphibian, an insect and a bird.
- To describe the life process of reproduction in some plants and animals.
- To describe how living things are classified into broad groups according to common observable characteristics and based on similarities and differences, including micro-organisms, plants and animals.

## **Maths**

#### Our maths topics this term are:

We will continue to consolidate and extend our mental maths ad fluency skills and calculating formal methods and strategies. We will be working both conceptually and procedurally.

When learning something new we encourage the children to use the CPA approach.

Concrete - using objects and equipment

Pictorial - represent their thinking using pictures

Abstract - using numbers and symbols to solve calculations

#### This term we will be learning to:

- Use databases linked to our living things classification work in science.
- Creating videos linked to climate change.

## **Other highlights**

### Forest School Sessions(Spring 1)

Each year group will take part in three Forest School sessions. They will support our work on the Wolf Wilder book which is set in the cold, Russian winter.

**Design and Technology** We will be looking at the issues of footwear in the Russian winters in the deciduous forest biome. We will design a make a suitable show for our key character, Feodora. Each child will need **just one** old trainer, croc, slider or flip flop to adapt. Can the children please have them in school for the project. The shoe **does not** actually have to fit their feet – could be smaller or larger.

**History** Our local study of 'How has Thakeham changed?' will support our 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Thakeham School.

**Geography** We will be looking at the range of biomes that cover our planet and focus on the tundra and the work of David Attenborough and Greta Thunberg.

**Music** We will be continuing to compose and perform on the recorder during this term, developing our rhythm skills and awareness and control or pitch through a theme of 'Can my music take you somewhere?'

Art and Design We will be creating a 3D model of a polar bear.

**RE** We will be exploring why prayer is important for Christians and why did Jesus have to die at Easter.

We will be thinking about and discussing what it is to be a good friend and classmate and then we will complete the Healthy Me unit of work. On January 15<sup>th</sup> we have a session booked with the **Little Life Savers** which Chris Poore, our Storrington Warden, will join us for.
